

THE HENRY CLIFTON SORBY AWARD:

The Sorby Award was established in 1975 to recognize outstanding contributions to the field of metallography. With growth of IMS and expansion in scope introduced by its members, the award now recognizes outstanding lifetime achievement in the broader fields of metallography and materials science. No more than one individual shall be selected to receive this award each year.

1. The nominee must be living.
2. The Nominee must be over the age of 55 on or before January 1st, for the year in which the Nominee is to be nominated.
3. The nominee must be considered an internationally recognized figure in the field of metallography and materials science.

The person selected need not be a member of IMS. He or she is nominated by the IMS Sorby Committee and must be approved by the Board of Directors of IMS. The award is a plaque presented at the annual convention of the Society. The recipient is expected to present a keynote lecture highlighting some aspect of his/her work. Travel costs to the annual meeting and standard expenses incurred by the awardee will be reimbursed by IMS.
